

### CEO REPORT

Happy Birthday to the Club Merrylands Bowling Group, formerly known as Merrylands Bowling Club on the remarkable achievement of reaching our 75th Anniversary. It is my great honour to be a contributor to this milestone journal.

The purpose of this journal is to celebrate and acknowledge the foresight of our founding Members, past and current Chairmans, Directors, Committees, Management, Staff and Members who have played an integral role in the journey of success of such a great Bowling Club Group as it stands today.

On the 8th of April 1948, 75 years ago, a group of 20 likeminded businessmen, led by the Mayor of Holroyd, met and passed a resolution to form a bowling club. A little over one year later the Club House and first green were officially opened. The Club House has been upgraded and extensively developed over the years, from the original tin shed with a single bowling green to the now well-appointed property that stands today, housing state-of-the-art facilities creating a competitive precinct for the game for which our charter was founded. In 2015 we amalgamated with Guildford Bowling Club and now have another premises with excellent appointments and championship greens.

Since the Bowling Club's inception, we have celebrated many achievements on the greens, from the first Pennant Flag in 1952, to champion bowlers and elite representatives for District, Zone, and State as you can read in this journal. In my tenure, I have seen us win the State Bowls Club of the Year in 2015 and most recently the National Bowls Club of the Year in 2022.

In 1988 the constitution was amended paving the way for Junior Membership at Merrylands. Youth programs and bowls development has featured prominently over the years with many home grown champions making their start at Merrylands and going on to represent NSW and achieve National titles.

The Club has always been a progressive organisation that has facilitated many changes over this time and has faced its fair share of challenges, including battling government legislation on gaming and smoking, the global financial crisis and, more recently, the worldwide pandemic.

But despite every challenge set before us, we have stood strong and continued to build a fantastic inclusive amenity that welcomes every demographic of our community and has created many memorable events through our history, with fun times and many achievements. Not many entities have lasted this long, and it is a testament to the people who contributed to the goal of the founding members proposal to build a Bowling Club on an old brickpit. As we drink from the well of our current successes, we should be ever mindful of those who dug the well.

I would like to take this opportunity to pay tribute to the late Ray Gillard who served our Club as Chairman for 26 years. During this time his passion and commitment to the Club and its members was evident, leading the Board to facilitate for the progression of our organisation and establishing a strong foundation for his successors. Ray joined the Board at a time when the club was floundering and it was through his tenacity and determination that the Club was able to reset and thrive again both on and off the greens

Today, both Clubs, Club Merrylands Bowling and Guildford Bowling are in high growth areas, with increasing economic potential, housing availability, improving local infrastructure and job opportunities. The growth of our amenity is paramount to servicing the needs of our thriving local community. The Club is in a great financial position as we continue to put plans in place to build a stronger future and to continue to propagate the sport of lawn bowls

With over 22,000 members, the purpose is to maintain a community hub for current-members and the growing members of the local area while continuing to be relevant and inclusive. Our aim is to continue to provide bowling, dining, event and function spaces, sports, and leisure experiences that cater to as many members of our community as possible.

We encourage you, your family, and friends to join with us on our journey to become the community hub of Cumberland. I truly believe our members are our greatest assets, and through your membership and support we have achieved longevity and success. The Board and Management appreciate the praise that many members have sent commending our Club on this special anniversary.

I would like to thank our Members and the Board for the support and confidence provided to me in my 22 years of service as Company Secretary and the support given to the Senior Management team, managers, and staff during this time.

The Club was founded on the 8th April 1948 and the following are excerpts of notes taken from that first meeting.

Aldermen William Campbell and William Simpson met one day in March, 1948 and discussed the feasibility of building a bowling club in Merrylands. Both considered it a brilliant idea, so a public meeting was called for Thursday, 8th April, 1948 to be held in the old council chambers.

Twenty people attended, namely:

Ald Bill Campbell, Mayor of Holroyd who occupied the chair, Ald Cliff Creen, Mayor of Fairfield and the President of Fairfield Bowling Club, Ald E. C Styles, Jim Brown – Headmaster of Merrylands public school, Stan Crane, Ray Giblin – Smallgoods Proprietor, Bill Simpson, Andy Colquhoun, Ernie Maunder – Real Estate Agent, Doug McLaren – Solicitor, Ernie Ward, Allan Merton – Chemist, Sel Vincent – Salesman, Sid Mills – Foreman Coach Builder, Len Young – Hardware Merchant, Cliff Stimson, Phil Arnett – Town Clerk of Holroyd, Bill Bright – Proprietor of "Biz " newspaper and two ladies, Mrs E McColough and Mrs F Bowden who attended to lend support to the proposal.

The meeting, though small, was in accord that a club should be formed and all those present who had agreed to Join, be the Committee of the Merrylands Bowling Club.

Before the meeting closed, it was decided that a meeting take place the following Sunday for the purpose of looking for a suitable site for the Club. There was an option on Merrylands Park where the council had made provision for a two green bowling area.

It was the committee opinion that such an area restricted the possible growth. Stan Crane suggested an area that was a disused clay pit, excavated to a depth of 7 feet (2.1 metres), full of stagnant water, reeds and rubbish which was owned by Messrs Newman and Underwood Tile Co Ltd. The Hon Solicitor and President called upon the Manager Arthur Talbot, of bowling fame, who agreed to put our request to the owners.

They agreed and sold the parcel of land (hole and all) for the princely sum of £175. The lot on the corner of Cambridge and Newman Streets was purchased from a Mrs Rowley for £112. It is of interest to note that the Council rates for the first year were £2.13.

A contract was let for putting down a green (No. 1), fencing and water services for £1,200. When it was time to grass the green, several members went to Warwick Farm Racecourse and collected 35 corn sacks of couch grass and put it through a chaff cutter and it was then laid by the contractor Mr Dowse. Before the green was ready, a second contract was let for a second green for £1,000.

The next problem was how to get Club rooms, as at this time there were strict building controls and all materials were directed to housing. However, in Bruce Street Merrylands, BW Simpson had closed his poultry farm and submitted the chook sheds to auction. These were obtained at low cost and, by voluntary labour, were transported and erected near the present site of the auditorium. All did not go smoothly however, as a visit from an Inspector of Building placed a stop building order and other plans had to be made. This problem has reoccurred in following extensions but, as then, they have been surmounted.

Finally, it came to pass that on the 30th of April, 1949 the official opening of the Club House and Number 1 Green took place in the presence of a large crowd of dignitaries, members, their wives, friends and visiting clubs who sat down to a sumptuous repast in a marquee which accommodated 200 people.

When we consider that all this took place just one year and 22 days after the first public meeting, we must laud the efforts of those early pioneers — a staggering effort indeed.

The occasion was noted in the local Biz Newspaper so: "Hundreds of people wending their way from all parts of Merrylands on Saturday last denoted that something out of the ordinary was to take place. Their rendezvous was the newly constructed green and rooms of Merrylands Bowling Club which was to be officially opened that afternoon."

The clubs that attended on the day were Parramatta, Wentworthville, Auburn, The Hills, Lidcombe, Lidcombe Hospital, Bankstown, Liverpool, Campbelltown, Austinmer, Guildford and Fairfield.

A month later the first Annual Meeting was held.

The Treasurer was able to announce a nett profit of £390. Monies for the club had been raised in the first place by debentures – £3,000 in all from members. The book assets were listed as £3,850. It must be noted that the club did not qualify for a liquor license at that stage and possessed only three poker machines. Spirit refreshments were obtained by Sel Vincent through his business connections while beer was organised by Len (Nobby) Clark and his associations with the Commercial Hotel in Parramatta.

Those of us who knew some of these early members have been fortunate to have met such worthy gentlemen.

The formation of a Bowling Club was passed at the Public Meeting held on Thursday 8 April 1948. The importance and aim of a Bowling Club being formed was to provide three things to the town, recreation, beautification of a park and an organisation which would be of great assistance to local charities. The Bowling Club was set to place the town on the map for all members of the community who shared the enjoyment of the age-old game of bowls, but also offer a place where people can meet to relax and enjoy the company of their friends – this is exactly what was achieved and has been maintained over the past 75 years.

Saturday 30th April 1949 – official opening of the No. 1 Green and Club House took place in the presence of a large gathering of interested friends, and numerous members from other clubs, a large marquee, tables and chairs were hired to accommodate approximately 200 persons.

Formed only about a year prior the members had worked so enthusiastically and to such good effect that also a miracle was performed in being able to open the Green for play in that short period.








1952 was the year that our first Pennant Flag was won, namely the No 5 Metropolitan Pennant – a fine achievement for such a young club.

In 1953 the Women's Bowling Club was formed and, on the 8 September 1953, their first official game was played.

With the continued growth of the Club the original Club House became inadequate and during the Presidency of George Whitworth, 1955-56, a contract was let for a twostorey brick building which formed part of the present building. On the 27 April 1957, the official opening of the new Club House was carried out by Tom Shakespeare the then President of the Royal NSWBA. The Club's President was Bill Campbell, the founding President.

In 1957 – 59 Sid Try became President and the old Club House which was referred to as "chook house" was relocated to the 3rd Merrylands Scout Group on Kenyons Road which was in operation to the end of 2022, and still stands today.

1958 saw the first State Flag by the No. 2 State Pennant. This made the Club eligible to play in No. 1 Pennants, a level that has been continuous to this day.



### 1953 -WOMEN'S BOWLING CLUB

It is truly an honour to be the Ladies' President of Merrylands Women's Club in this, the Club's 75th year. I am somewhat of a newcomer to bowls having been introduced to the sport four years ago as part of Cumberland Council's Seniors week, and have not looked back. I am now in my second year as President and have quickly understood that our Club is the hub for all our bowlers. Great friendships are formed and everyone is so welcoming.

Merrylands Bowling Club was founded on 8th April 1948 but it was not until 5 years later that the Women's Bowling Club was founded after a meeting was held in one of the ladies homes on 18th May 1953. From the minutes of that meeting, 18 ladies were made foundation members of the Women's Bowling Club (WBC). On 8th September 1953 the first meeting and official game was held. Two years later the Women's Club was making their presence felt by winning 3 Major Shield/Pennants.

Since that time the standard of our bowlers has always been high and our current players continue to be high achievers. The Ladies' Office Bearers and bowling achievements over the last 70 years are too many to be listed here but can be seen on our website in the Honour Boards section.

The major achievement for any club is to win a pennant flag and have a member represent their country. Merrylands have done this on a number of occasions.

The WBC in 2023 currently has 60 members in total with not all playing. We currently have four life members:

#### Irene Mares - 2002

Past Ladies' President & Deputy Chairman of the Board and now Club Ltd Patron since 2021

#### Marie Heard - 2006

Past Ladies' President and Ladies Club Patron 2010 - 2023

#### Maureen Randell – 2017

Ladies' Secretary since 2006 and Director since 2022

#### Elaine Penman - 2023

Past Ladies President, Vice President, member of the social committee and selector

Robyn Smith was a Director from 2015 to 2022 and we have also had two members (Willow Fong and Dorothy Roche) inducted into Women's Bowls NSW Hall of Fame.

The Women's Bowling Club are fortunate to have Willow Fong still playing with us. Willow has achieved the rare distinction of representing Australia and Fiji and in 1985 was named Fiji Sports Woman of the Year. Among her many achievements she also played for NSW and represented Australia in the Asia Pacific Games and World Bowls in 1996. In the 1998 Commonwealth Games, Willow won gold in the Womens Pairs with with Karen Murphy AM. Willow attends all our social games and is a great inspiration to all our members. She also entertains us with many colourful stories from those old days!

We were lucky enough to have Val Smith begin her Merrylands career as a Marquee player, flying over from New Zealand with one of her best friends Jo Edwards. In 2020 an opportunity to become the Ladies Bowls Coordinator was available and Val took on the role in a heartbeat moving herself and her partner Charlie across the Tasman. During her time at Merrylands, Val won Commonwealth Games medals and many other international events. In 2017, Val was runner up in the NSW Champion of Champion Singles. Val also worked on training the lady bowlers and would go out of her way to help them. In 2021, as COVID hit, Val and Charlie decided to move back to New Zealand to be closer to family and friends.

WBC have social bowls every Thursday morning from 9am followed by lunch. On the first Thursday of each month men are invited to play with the ladies. This is a great opportunity to socialise and new members are always welcome. Training is available for new and current members and the opportunity to represent your club in pennants is there for everyone. Our most recent achievement in February 2023 has been two Merrylands ladies, Jenny Clark and Dafna Orbach, playing in the Inaugural District Seniors Singles final which was won by Jenny Clark.



The year 1962 saw the letting of a further contract, this time for the Auditorium, a new kitchen and bar. This new addition to the Club was opened on 18 May 1963 and the Auditorium was the host to many events, meetings, social gatherings as well as many bowling members showing their talents as entertainers with a Debutantes Ball with role reversals and Club Marching Girls providing much entertainment for all. Our Club and its achievements on and off the green reflected great respect and high regard within the bowling fraternity. The Royal NSWBA and all other clubs gave enormous credit to those who had so capably been responsible for the progress over such a comparatively short period of time.












On the 12 March 1972, the third green and extensions were open. A third green, in conjunction with the two smaller greens gave sufficient playing area to cope with any situation. The enlarged Club House enabled our Club to service those who used the greens and to extend further hospitality to the community.

1973 marked the 25th Anniversary of the Club – leading up to this Anniversary, the achievements both on and off the green reflected great credit to those members responsible for the progress made over such a comparatively short period of time. The Club had established great fellowship, achieved many sporting achievements, and earned great respect and high standing within the bowling fraternity.

A celebration was held dedicated to those men who were present for each phase of the Club development. During the 25 years much had been accomplished by the numerous members who had participated in many working bees and laborious work, but it was the membership spirit that aided this progression.



The implementation in the late 70s of further extensions including additions of a new dining room, kitchen, bar, cool rooms, storerooms, and delivery dock caused quite an upheaval during the work with struts, braces and other building materials scattered throughout the premises. On completion in 1980 members were surprised with the results of the new amenity.

During 1980 -1982 the first professional coach Ken Metham was appointed and in 1984 the Men's Bowling Club won the No. 6 Pennant.

In 1985, Phil Bushby replaced Ken as Coach and he instigated the first International Mixed Pairs, that is well recognised in the world of Bowls today.

In 1987 the Articles of the Club were changed giving all bowling members equal status in the control and administration of the Club.

In 1987 building commenced including our indoor bowling stadium which was estimated at 1.4 million.

We can only wonder if those dedicated foundation members would have realised that their foresight would have created such a sustainable asset in the community from the purchase of land for only  $\pounds$ 287.

1988, our Club has made remarkable achievements with the addition of the number one Restaurant operated by Food Choice plus the indoor bowling stadium and over \$1 million profit.

These developments did not come without a lot of planning and thought from the Board. A special mention should be made to Carl Metcalfe who led the design and development committee working extremely hard to achieve the objectives.

1989 with Bryan Bryant as Men's President and Mavis McNab as Lady President, we achieved the distinction of winning No. 4 Pennant Flag, No. 7 Metropolitan Flag and featured in a No. 1 Pennant Final.



















This decade commenced with more heartache for the men's No. 1 Pennant side going down in the State final for the second year in a row to Grandviews and the No. 2 also falling at the final hurdle going down in the final. However, success wasn't far away with the ladies winning the No. 1 State Pennant in 1991.

1990's saw the completed refurbishment of the poker machine and lounge area with the plan to upgrade the bar. A new extension which was not only our indoor stadium, where the internationally famous Jack High tournament was held attracting bowlers from all around the world. Our everpopular Food Choice Family Restaurant was opened as part the first stage in 1994 and is still going strong today. More success wasn't far away, many achievements were obtained on the green with the ladies winning State No 2. Pennants in 1993 and the men's No. 7 State Pennant in 1993 and again in 1996. Unfortunately, 1996 did have a heartbreaking loss for our No. 1s going down by one shot in the State Final.

Club Merrylands Bowling had very fine bowlers representing the Club at the highest-level winning State Fours, Ray Gillard, Ian Hansell, Peter Stockham and Mark Parella.



In 2002 refurbishment areas included the indoor Bowling stadium being converted into the gaming lounge with and dining offering - Café by the Green with a total cost of \$5.5 million dollars for the benefit and enjoyment of our members and guests.

The Ladies tasted success in 2007 conquering all by winning the No. 1 State Pennant. 2009 saw the construction of our first outdoor gaming.

This landmark addition to our facilities received the goahead by the two key approval authorities Holroyd Council, known today as Cumberland Council, and the NSW Liquor Administration Board. This striking open air feature on the side facing Oxford Street, contained gaming machines that had been housed in the inside gaming lounge, freeing up considerable interior space enabling the expansion of thoroughfares.

The foyer received a makeover giving visitors first impressions that count, making a more spacious area for traffic flow, easier to sign in and allowing members to enter the club with ease.

The makeover for Food Choice Family Restaurant and the construction was completed and the plan for the three-level car park for 150 vehicles unfolded with the aim that these enhancements would take our Club to another level of sophistication and enhance our assets for the good of the members well into the 21st century.

This was another decade that commenced with early success on the green with the Men winning the No. 7 State Pennants in 2010 and the NSW Premier League in 2011.

Renovations were underway transforming the existing gaming lounge with modern décor, new carpet, lighting, furniture, upgrading the foyer, main bar area and bathrooms being completed in 2013 seen success on the green with our men winning the Champions League.

The Board led by Chairman Ray Gillard worked hard on the master plan with the DA being lodged with Council in 2015 for the expansion of the carpark to 420 spaces and the plan for a multipurpose auditorium/bowlers lounge and function rooms.

2015 also saw the amalgamation with Guildford Bowling Club which was an exciting venture and a great asset to Club Merrylands Bowling. Also in 2015, Club Merrylands Bowling won Bowls Club of the Year.

In 2017 the finalisation of the masterplan was completed and awaiting DA approval with the plan including a grand entrance and foyer off the recently extended multi deck car park, ground floor multipurpose lounge linked to the alfresco pavilion between bowling greens, family friendly dining precinct including a children's play area and 1st floor function centre catering for increased capacity.

2019 the first stage of our new amenity opened and created a WOW factor that was second to none. The new Club House was appreciated by all and became a point of interest within the community gaining momentum in terms of increased visitation to the main club.









It is with great pride that for the 75th Anniversary of Club Merrylands Bowling I hold the position of Bowls Co-ordinator. When I moved to NSW for this position from Victoria back in March 2017, I was aware of the powerhouse status of the Club and of the presence of some of the best players across Australia, which attracted me to the club. Since moving and taking up my position I have learned so much more about the rich and famed history of Club Merrylands Bowling along with the warmth and generosity of the current members and also what it does for the community in general.

During my time here the Club has undergone a major redevelopment, and the bowling members now have first class facilities to use and show off to visiting bowlers. Our members continue to move with the times, including how we engage with our members via the website, facebook, and even the use of apps on their smart phones. This is major development as previously communication was generally only posted on the noticeboard. Teams and rinks for social bowls are displayed on the big screen by the bowls office so that members know what rink they are on and who they are playing with. Highlights from this year include National Pairs winners and National Fours Silver medallist, State Open Pairs and Open Fours titles, State Junior Singles winner, Zone 10 Club of the year, winning five out of the six Zone 10 Open Championships, District and Regional titles, and qualifying for the State Pennant Finals in Open Grades 1, 2 and 4, Men's Divisions 1 and 2, and Women's Division 3.

## BOWLS DEVELOPMENT

I would like to acknowledge the great achievement of Club Merrylands Bowling in reaching 75 years of operation. To not only make it to this milestone, but to see the position the Club finds itself in having achieved exponential growth, financial stability, and success on the greens at all levels, is truly remarkable. It is my pleasure to have been associated with the Club through my volunteer school sports roles for nearly two decades, and I am now looking forward to many years of being employed at the Club, with a major focus being the development of junior bowling.

One of the best things about being involved with a like Club Merrylands Bowling is that they always have a focus on the future and working towards making the Club strong both on and off the greens. A major part of this is the development of junior players. Club Merrylands Bowling has a long and successful history in developing and supporting young bowlers and now, as we are in our 75th year, I am proud to play a part in this.

The Club has always had strong representation and been successful in junior bowls over the years, but further developed this when they began mass recruiting school aged players in 2003. Under the watchful eye of head coach, and former Commonwealth Games representative, Bryce Stewart, over 300 students were put through their paces over 3 days. From this group, 14 went on to then represent Club Merrylands Bowling. In the following years, at least 8 locally developed juniors went on to win Club Championships at Merrylands and/or play Grade 1 Pennants.

In 2004, Club Merrylands Bowling began financially assisting the bowls programs of the Sydney West School Sport Association. This assistance continues to this day, allowing all eligible students to represent at all school bowls levels despite the heavy costs involved in these pathways. Nearly 100 students and their families have been supported by this arrangement to date which underpins the support the Club has provided.

South African International, legend of bowls, and all-round good guy Neil Burkett began as Club Coach at Merrylands in 2010. During his time as Club Coach Neil brought a lot of success to the Club and was a great mentor for the junior bowlers. In 2011, Neil and young gun Zeljko Trbara played off in the NSW Open singles final with the master Neil getting one over the youngster. In 2012 Neil led the Club to success in the Champions League, the highest competition at the time in NSW. In 2015 Neil won the State Fours and was runner up in the State Pairs. This was the year Neil was also bestowed NSW Bowler of the Year. Neil continued working at the Club and bringing along the newer bowlers and many of the top players at the Club now have all worked with Neil at some stage.

Looking to the future, there are several initiatives in the works, including developing teaching programs for bowls for implementation within local schools, and the unveiling of a youth academy. This will coincide with yet another major recruitment drive for new and established junior bowlers. I'm sure the next 25 years will be even more successful with the hard work and dedication that everyone involved with Club Merrylands Bowling exhibits on a daily basis.



He genuinely cared about the local community overseeing millions of dollars of community grant donations throughout his tenure. Ray was an active member of the Club's Charity Committee which in 1997 raised funds for the Children's Hospital Westmead and supported ongoing partnerships with local schools and community organisations along the way.

Adding to these important roles was also the involvement and participation in the sport of lawn bowls as a player, committee member and Zone selector. His role in the promotion of junior bowls saw many new players taking up the sport and his commitment in retaining 'the magic' of the sport was second to none.

Ray lived by the motto: Its not what the club can give you, but what you can give to the club. He was always willing to put his time and energy into what was important to him – family, friendships, bowls, and Club Merrylands Bowling.



He was a good communicator, his presence, jokes, wit and intellect ensured an enjoyable conversation. ### Hilltop Road Public School and Club Merrylands Bowling Partnership

The partnership between Club Merrylands Bowling and Hilltop Road was first established in early 2000, when Club Merrylands Bowling first supported the **Transition to School Program** at Hilltop Road, through the ClubGRANTS program. Little did we know then the impact this partnership would have on the school and the wider community.

The program evolved into the **"Ready Set Go 4 Kindy"** transition to school program, which is now in its 17th year. With over 1000 families attending the 20 week program to prepare young children for school life, the program assists both students and parents in building a strong foundation to school life, and identifies any challenges or needs they may have.

Ready Set Go 4 Kindy provides a positive experience for families and an understanding of what school is like in Australia. Families develop a good understanding of what and how we teach in Australia, and any fears parents may have are addressed including non-English speaking parents who learn how best to support their children in this critical phase of their young lives.

The full impact of our partnership with Club Merrylands Bowling is hard to quantify on paper, but with each individual that participates in a workshop or program supported by the Club, there is a flow on affect that will steer them on a path that can enable new friendships, open doors to new opportunities, teach, learn, share engage, create and develop a sense of belonging in the Hilltop Road community.

Club Merrylands Bowling support doesn't end there with multiple initiatives supported by the Club. These include the donation of a Courtesy Bus, and funding for a "Kitchen Garden Program" for over 200 students. 2016 also saw the partnership grow stronger with students participating in bowling at the Club and the ladies bowling team sharing their expertise and knowledge with the students by teaching them to knit and crochet.

The partnership is also a reciprocal one where the school has provided support to members of the Club through the technology program computer courses and also the Connecting Community Project which focused on engaging local seniors and elders and provide weekly opportunities to come together cook, share skills, learn something new and socialise with our school students, staff, and community.

Club Merrylands Bowling will continue to do everything it can to give back to our community through its various support programs. It remains a priority of our club to assist those worthy local organisations who support better health, education, quality of life and the general well-being of those people who live in our community.
